

A MESSAGE FROM NEWFOLDEN FIRE CHIEF - CODY UNDERDAHL

A fire department's water tender is an important piece of equipment, especially living in rural areas. The primary task of this piece of equipment is to shuttle water to a fire where a large supply line is not available.

Our previous water tender was a 1980 Mack that was leased to us in cooperation with the Minnesota DNR. It had little to no exhaust and one, maybe two, emergency lights. However, the emergency lights were not always needed as the top speed was around 49 miles per hour, with a good tail wind. That truck came to our community as a previous military truck. It was built into a water tender and served our community well since 1999. For 26 years it shuttled a great deal of water for not only our community, but also our neighboring communities.

One of Newfolden Fire's recent goals was to update this truck. Through our search process we connected again with our Minnesota DNR partners. They now offer the same assistance program, however this time we were able to purchase a truck. Build it to our needs and it would be ours, instead of leasing it. We were able to purchase a 2006 Freightliner. Much like its predecessor, this truck also in its previous life served the military. The water tank was taken from our previous water tender, cut down, painted, and placed on the newly painted frame and body of the new Freightliner. There were numerous custom pieces added: emergency lights, siren, radio, backup camera, rear storage container, hitch, 1-inch quick attach line, wildfire line, and external pump with 1 ½ hose capabilities.

This truck was paid in full due to budgetary saving, community donations, and elbow grease. It will proudly serve our communities for decades.
